

Comfort Medication Guide: Bisacodyl Suppository

INTRODUCTION TO BISACODYL SUPPOSITORY

Bisacodyl is a medication often prescribed as a part of a comfort kit provided by the hospice agency to manage constipation at the end-of-life. It works by stimulating the bowels by activating the smooth muscle of the intestine.

Medication	 Purpose of use in hospice care is to provide relief to patients who are
Description	experiencing constipation
	• Take at prescribed dose, not more frequently or at higher dose than prescribed.
Medication Dosing	Per rectal route
	Ensure to unwrap suppository before inserting.
	• Typically provides benefit in 15 minutes to 1 hour.
	• If symptoms of constipation have not improved with consistent use, please notify
	hospice nurse, taking more than prescribed is not likely to improve symptoms.
	Adjustments to dose are to be determined by hospice provider based on response
	 Lay on side with lower leg straightened and upper leg bent forward
	 Lift buttocks, unwrap suppository and insert ½ to 1 inch into rectum
Administration	
	Continue to lay down for 15-20 minutes to allow suppository to melt
	The following may occur when starting bisacodyl suppository therapy. Many have no
	side effects or only these minor side effects.
Most Common	Abdominal pain
Side Effects	Abdominal cramps
	Rectal burning
	Please contact your hospice team if side effects persist or are severe
Drug interactions	Taking with other laxatives may enhance adverse/toxic effects of laxatives
	Be sure the hospice agency has an updated list of all medication's patient taking
Medication	Should be stored at room temperature
Storage	Keep away from light, moisture and children
